Dear Senator,

On behalf of the National Assocation of School Psychologists (NASP), AASA, the School Superintendents Association, and the undersigned 44 education and mental health organizations, we urge you to support floor amendment 2529 to S. 4638, the FY25 National Defense Authorization Act, and consider its inclusion in any Managers Package that moves to the floor.

This amendment authorizes The CARE for Student Mental Health Act, which codifies and clarifies the purpose of the Mental Health Services Professionals Demonstration Grant (renamed the Strengthening the Pipeline of Mental Health Providers Program) and the School Based Mental Health Services Grant Program (SBMH). These grants, which received significant investments via the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, are critical to addressing the youth mental health crisis and ensuing ongoing comprehensive school safety efforts. The Mental Health Services Professionals grant increases the number and diversity of properly trained and fully credentialed school based mental health providers through partnerships between institutions of higher education and LEAs. SBMH provides financial support to high needs LEAs to hire new and retain existing school mental health staff to improve their capacity to meet the mental health needs of all students and make progress toward recommended staffing ratios of school psychologists, counselors, and social workers.

Importantly, the CARE for Student Mental Health Act creates greater equity in the distribution of future grant awards, addresses key concerns raised by prospective applicants and school leaders, and remedies major inefficiencies in the grant application process that have made it challenging for students and educators in small and rural districts, including those who serve military connected families, to benefit from these federal investments.
